- *Re Tang Hoi Chun* [\[2024\] 3 HKC 222](#), [\[2024\] HKDC 143](#) – vacation of registration of charging orders over a property
- *HKSAR v Chiu* [\[2023\] HKDC 1760](#) (led by Selwyn Yu SC with Brian Tsui) – defence of charge of practising medicine without registration; first time criminal Court ruled legislation on practising medicine without registration only applies to Western medicine
- *Huang Lidong v Kwong Wing Chung* [2023] 2 HKLRD 927, [\[2023\] HKDC 461](#) – appeal against Master’s decision after final judgment has been sealed and perfected; the argument that court’s appellate jurisdiction is not functus officio was first rejected by the Judge in Chambers but later agreed and adopted by the Court of Appeal ([Huang Lidong v Kwong Wing Chung \[2024\] HKCA 465](#))
